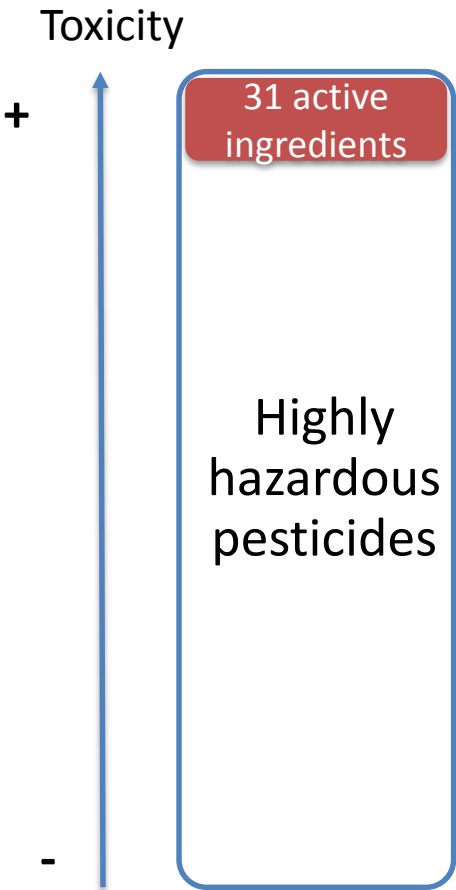
Content: Policy elements

- Regulation of the use of HHPs taking into account risk
- Reparation and compensation of damages to environmental values and human health

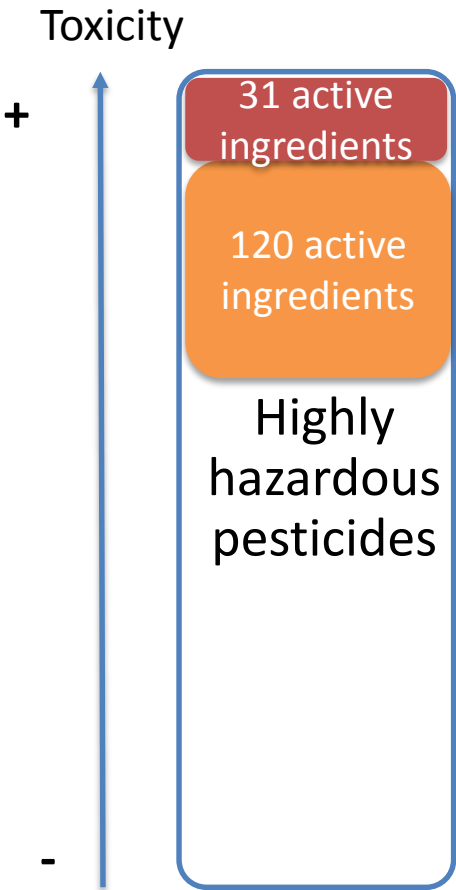
